(Pocket-lint) - There's a certain HP style these days, with curved edges, large trackpads and subtle prints on the body. This signature style is in the pavilion dv6, the machine is designed to look good in a modern home. The combination of the Core i5 processor with The Radeon amD graphics makes this machine powerful enough for most users, including games and media work (and with 64-bit Windows Home Premium and 6GB of RAM, there's plenty of performance to get around). The thin drawing of the grain on the dv6 lid is much less defined than many other HP case designs, with the slightly raised HP logo that glows white when dv6 is on. Open the lid and there is a metal palm resting with the same small grainy pattern. This handy and groove grain means your hands don't slip all over the keyboard while you're trying to play a portal or fill a complex table. You'll find your hands neatly placed over a slightly recessed keyboard, making typing very handy - despite the lack of any real keyboard rake. The glossy plastic volume screen works well with a bright, glossy screen, and provides a clear contrast to the slightly matte look of the rest of the machine (and this time the difference in materials looks like a deliberate contrast rather than a bad match). At 2.9kg it's a bit on the heavy side for a 15.6-inch unit, but it's well balanced and comfortable for hold. Like most HP laptops, the dv6 has a shiklet-style keyboard, with wide-placed black keys that are easy to find even if you have thumbs up. There's a lot of travel and good action with a good click on the panel. Since it's a widescreen machine, there's plenty of room for a numerical keyboard, though it leaves the keyboard a little shifted from a large, illuminated trackpad. Gamers will appreciate the possibility of using the numerical keyboard as an additional, much larger set of direction keys. The keys are not illuminating, something that is a little distracting compared to the glowing boundary around the trackpad, and combined with the narrow font used for the letters on the keys, it makes the DV6 machine for brightly lit rooms. Function keys are installed as screen brightness, volume and media control, with the Fn key to flip them back into original mode if necessary. A special web button opens up your web browser, something that seems redundant with Windows 7 challenge bar pinning. We were surprised to find very few indicators, just a light on the Wi-Fi key to show that you are online, and the subtle light powering on the power button. Funny there's light on the fingerprint sensor that flashes when you power on - letting you know that you can log in with your fingers, not just a traditional password in case you miss the sensor among all the stickers. The large trackpad is slightly shifted from the center, giving you a lot more palm rest space on the right (but not enough to pretty central to enter). It is surrounded by a very bright white LED ring, and has separate buttons - unlike many recent HP devices. It's responsive, with a slightly slick feel to the surface, scaling the motion pointer in response to the speed of your fingers. Moving the pointer slowly, and the complete detour is only about 60% of the screen. Faster and you're all way through now at all. You can adjust the usual range of two and three finger gestures, as well as control the scrolling areas; Click on the top left corner of the trackpad to temporarily disable it (and turn the surrounding glow from white to orange). The 15.6-inch 1366 x 768 LED backlight screen is better than most, with a crisp, relatively high contrast display that is perfect for most day-to-day PC tasks. We found some contrast problems when looking at HD video, with the dark elements of the image lost in the background. Playing 1080p web streaming video was good. A local copy of the 720p video played clearly, without stuttering, and with a good clear sound. A drop of hinge lowers the screen behind the BODY of the DV6, giving you a nice clear viewing angle. The dv6 speakers are behind a narrow grille under the screen, at an angle, to direct the sound to the user. They are not of the highest quality, but they are clear, and much better than those installed on many machines at this price. We found audio distortion on large volumes, and Beats audio processing equipment left things sounding a bit bass heavy, with tin trebles. You can set up Beats, but it will take time to get the sound just right. HP's summer sale has a bunch of bargains - check out these stunners! (promo) HP given the dv6 many ports on the left and right sides (drop screen means the rear is not available). The left side has VGA and HDMI ports for video as well as Ethernet and welcome two USB 3.0 ports. There are also two headphone jacks and one microphone, so you can share the sound of a game or movie without disturbing anyone around you. On the right there are two USB 2.0 ports and a LightScribe DVD. On the front you will find a reader of media cards, with support for SD and MMC cards. Wireless includes Bluetooth and 802.11 b/g/n Wi-Fi. Overall performance is good, with a second-generation Core i5 processor and 6GB of RAM (there's room for another 2GB). There's a lot of storage, with a 640GB 5400rpm hard drive. It may not be the fastest on the market, but it does have a lot of storage, enough to make the dv6 suitable for a family PC. Apps run fast, and performance is good even when running with integrated graphics (there's GPU acceleration on both maps). Battery life was reasonable; Using dv6 with Wi-Fi and using integrated graphics gave us about 3 hours of use before the machine fell into hibernation. DV6 uses an ATI-switched graphics that can automatically switch from the discrete Radeon HD6490M to Intel's integrated HD graphics when exchanged between the air conditioner and the battery. To Switch means you need to close all running apps - it's not something you can do on the fly, as with Optimus graphics switching Nvidia. Even so, it's well worth doing as switching to integrated graphics can almost double battery life when using a balanced power plan, so this is what we certainly recommend for those who want to take DV6 and so as most HP machines have a lot of bundled software, including Norton Internet Security and Microsoft Office Starter. There are also installers for a range of internet tools, including Skype and a music station, as well as on-screen links to eBay and HP's own gaming service. Perhaps the strangest part in the Magic Desktop software bundle, a tool designed to provide a secure shell for children to use a computer - is reminiscent of the much-derided Microsoft Bob. More usefully, there is also a copy of the latest version of Windows Live Essentials, including Photo Gallery 2011 and Live Mail 2011. HP Verdict has assembled a capable, well-designed laptop in dv6. It's fast and efficient, with a reasonable battery life and a large, clear display. Obviously designed for a home user on a budget, you're going to get a lot more bang for your buck than you'd expect as HP builds on the work done in the high-end Envy series and styling is really on the cut above most laptops and the chassis is sturdy without being bulky. Sadly Beats Audio is subject to integrated speakers, but as you keep the volume down you don't have to be affected. The Core i5 may not be Intel's most powerful processor, but it is more than capable and must support the most common needs, from gaming to video editing. (Pocket-lint) - HP has been a bit of a revelation in recent months, releasing a number of great laptops that hit different price points but always beat their target market firmly and directly. So it happens somehow amazing to find dv9341eu is lacking. The appearance is great and given the favorable price, so is the build quality. The body feels solid and there is a lot of support holding the screen in place. Being a big machine, the keyboard has a lot of space and there is even room for a separate numerical keyboard. The keys weren't the most solidly built we've seen in recent times, and while they were easy to use, there was a degree of rattle as we were on the types. Like a 17-inch machine with a widescreen Super-TFT panel, this laptop is not designed to be too portable, so the weight of 3.7 kg should not be too interfering. The 2-hour battery life we managed to get wouldn't be great if it weighed half as much, but for use in the garden, or on the couch, as we did, it's more than good. However, this machine is smashed as a replacement desktop or multimedia machine. is that we just didn't find it powerful enough for this kind of role. Based on the AMD 1.8 GHz Turion 64 X2 Mobile TL-56 with 1GB of memory in support, we expected a lot of energy and performance from this system system while, to be honest, he ran well enough, we didn't feel as if he had coped with multitasking. The graphics are no better. We would expect a multimedia machine - even at this price - to have an updated GPU, but the Nvidia GeForce Go 7600 is the previous generation and was superseded by the 8400M GS, which is what you need at least if you want to run any of the DirectX 10 games that have to come out, since this old card just doesn't support the DX10. It's not all bad news, since this machine may lack advanced components, but we found the built-in extras were a little more compelling for their multimedia aspirations. For example, you'll find built-in Altec Lansing speakers, the sound quality is impressive and with a number of quick access keys to run your own HP app, you can easily manage movies and music. If you copy files on a disk, you can use the latest technology on disc writing, LightScribe, as the DVD-reuters supports it. Verdict HP Pavilion dv9341eu offers a better value for price and build than satisfy most people. However, don't come to this notebook expecting it to be something special. If your needs are simple, you'll be happy, but we expect and want a little more energy under the hood from a machine as big as this. Written by Mike Brown.
